

What you need to know before your Breast Ultrasound

What is a Breast Ultrasound?

A breast ultrasound is a painless procedure that uses sound waves to make images of the breast tissues.

When is a Breast Ultrasound performed?

A breast ultrasound is usually performed in addition to a mammogram to learn more about a breast lump and/or abnormality.

How should I prepare for my Breast Ultrasound?

- You may want to wear a comfortable 2 piece outfit as you will need to undress from the waist up and change into a gown for the imaging procedure.
- Please <u>arrive 15 minutes</u> before your appointment time to allow enough time for registration and time to change into a gown.

How long will my Breast Ultrasound take?

Plan to be at your appointment for approximately 1 hour. This allows time for registration, changing, and imaging; as well as for time for the technologist and/or radiologist to review your images. The ultrasound procedure itself takes about 20-30 minutes.

What should I expect during my Breast Ultrasound?

- You will be asked to lie down on the examination table and the technologist will put ultrasound gel on your breast.
- The technologist will use a small hand-held device (called a transducer) to take images of your breast.
- After the test is complete, you may wipe the gel off your skin.
- You may be asked to wait a few minutes for the technologist and/or radiologist to review the images to make sure the pictures are clear and complete.

How will my Breast Ultrasound feel?

You may feel slight pressure from the hand-held device pressing against your breast tissue, but this should not be painful. If you experience any pain or discomfort during the procedure, please let the technologist know.

How long will it take to get the results of my Breast Ultrasound?

It will take approximately 1 week to get the results of your breast ultrasound.
